

Remarks to Congressional Staffers on Critical Race Theory

First, what I would like you to understand, and your bosses to understand, is that we're fighting Marxism. In Critical Race Theory we're confronting Marxism. In Black Lives Matter we're confronting Marxism.

I guess I should say a word about Marxism, because it is not taught at school anymore and the press lies about it. Politifact says Marxism is just a way to analyze "social change through an economic lens."

That is a lie. Yes, Marx looked at life through a warped economic lens, but Marxism is much more than that.

Marxism is the belief that the economy should be planned by the government, which should own the means of production. It also believes that individual property should not exist. Communists also believe that the family, the base of society, should also not exist. Also, working for wages or a salary is slavery, according to Marx.

That, too, is a lie. It is Marxism that has always ended in slavery, with man reduced to an automaton who is accountable to an unaccountable ruler. It always ends in breadlines, because it eliminates the market's price-discovery mechanism; in double speak, because dissent cannot be allowed when the people in government cannot be removed; and in Gulags, for those who can't abide by those rules.

These are all good reasons to oppose communism, and why this country has always been at the forefront of the opposition to communism.

A feature of Marxist analysis is that society is divided between categories of oppressors and categories of the oppressed. Under communism's economic lens, these categories are the proletariat and the bourgeoisie.

Critical Theory, the earlier Marxist discipline that led to the Critical Race Theory of today, put the emphasis on culture rather than the economy, which is why it is sometimes called Cultural Marxism. The proletariat was not rebelling as Marx had predicted, because he'd rather put his energy into becoming a bourgeois. So members of the working class had to be put through re-education sessions in order to change this persnickety "false consciousness."

We see that today with the training programs and school curricula that adults and children are being forced through, which are nothing but forms of workplace harassment and forms of child abuse, both of which are illegal, as states across the land are finding.

Except one thing has changed, and race is now the critical factor. That is because Critical Theory's offshoot, Critical Race Theory, took that warped thinking and added "Race."

The new oppressor category was the white, Protestant or at least Christian, man, and he oppressed was everyone else.

These can be fluid, and in fact are shifting now. White women drew an analogy between their suffering and that of black people in the 1960s when they became a victim class. There was even talk of "Jane Crow."

But now, white women are becoming "Karens" and oppressors. Robin DiAngelo, the CRT trainer, has an entire chapter in her book *White Fragility* devoted to what she calls "White Women's Tears."

Jews—one of the most truly victimized people in history—are now oppressors, too, and we're seeing a new wave of anti-Semitic attacks all over the world in the wake of inflammatory language from BLM and the Squad.

Asian-Americans, too, have joined the ranks of the oppressors. They get into elite universities at too high a rate, and prize hard work, literacy and intact families. So they are now “white adjacent.”

So, whoever succeeds through individual striving and hard work becomes an oppressor. Why is that? Why? Because CRT doesn’t want you to succeed. When you succeed, and you’re not a white male Protestant, well, you’re showing that America is not ground zero for “systemic racism” after all. But above all, because when you succeed, you are joining the system, rather than tearing it down. And CRT proponents don’t want you to perpetuate the system; they want you to destroy it.

Proponents of CRT believe that the Civil Rights Era was aborted when it did not remove the system that was in power in the United States prior to 1964. The Civil Rights Act removed legally enforced racism, de jure racism, but did not eliminate the facto racism that CRT believes is everywhere.

What CRT believers wanted was regime change. They believe that everything is tainted with racism—the institutions, the traditions, the norms, even the language. All of them need replacing, but the Civil Rights Act just did not finish the job. And now they want to finish the job.

They are getting close. They are invading our classrooms, our workplaces, even the military, which makes CRT also a national security threat. American military personnel, men and women who take an oath to defend the Constitution and then go abroad to defend their country, are being asked to read material that delegitimizes the first and alienates from the latter.

It is your job and your boss's job to stop Critical Race Theory. Luckily, the American people are waking up. We are seeing a rising wave of opposition to the Marxist concepts they were trying to push on children and their parents.

The far left did not expect this level of defiance, and it is dismayed. But those fighting all this will realize that their actions will be popular. The American people are too attached to liberty to buy into any of these concepts.
